Dear Members,


Why not explore and exploit the fun and excitement nature has to offer in the monsoons.





The Chairman wishes to see more members participating and promises to guide them. This will result into high skill talent of National & International stature from our JVPG Club.




TALK ON FINANCIAL MARKETS BY MR. RAAMDEO AGRAWAL

n times of massive volatility in the financial markets and foreign exchange markets - the Library Sub-Committee headed by Mr. Yash Bhuta organized a talk by Mr. Raamdeo Agrawal - MD of Motilal Oswal Financial Services Ltd. The talk was held at the Activity hall on 5th July 2013 From 6.30 onwards.

Raamdeo Agrawal was as candid as always in his talk. Some highlights of his talk are as follows:

- India is still undoubtedly one of the most promising country & the fundamentals of Indian growth story is still firmly in place.
- Though currently we see a lot of pessimism and weak sentiments amongst investors - this is a very good chance to buy. A lot of value stocks are available at cheap prices.
- He shared that the key of his wealth creation has been the strategy of 'Buy and Hold'. He believes that the best strategy is to buy blue chips and then hold long term. He emphasized the importance of investing in blue chips and good quality scripts which have a proven track record and a matured and experienced management.
- For retail small investors Mr. Raamdeo Agrawal

recommended investing in mutual funds through SIP (systematic investment plan) but before this - a thorough research of the fund manager must be done.

- Through a presentation with facts and figures Mr. Agrawal demonstrated how investing in stocks is the most rewarding asset class as compared to real estate or Gold.
- Investing in gold is not a very good investment in his view.
 At most one can expect to make a return which would be equal to the inflation.
- As of the value of the Indian rupee versus the American dollar - he was of the opinion that he correction was due and now is complete. He expects the dollar to remain at around Rs. 60 for. While before the rupee starts appreciating again.

The talk was followed by a question and answer session and the audience which included over 150 participants asked their queries which were answered in detail by Raamdeo Agrawal.

Finally the President, Anil Mahesh and Hon. Jt. Secretary, Himanshu Gokani of our club thanked Mr. Raamdeo Agrawal. The members were very happy with this rare chance of having a one to one with one of India's wizards of Dalal Street.

It was a truly thought provoking play and the Sr citizen's truly enjoyed this play.








How to reach: A 227 km drive from the Delhi makes it a ideal adventure and spiritual retreat. .

Stay in your tented cottage along the holy Ganges and set out to experience some of the best extreme sports the region has to offer, from the popular white water rafting, to lesser known activities like quad biking, bungee jumping, Devi Darshan trek, mountain biking, rock climbing, hiking and canoeing. For a more relaxed experience you can choose to take some yoga lessons and indulge in a soothing massage. A weekend of adventure will leave you energized and rejuvenated and stress free for a while at least, till you plan that next weekend getaway!

MORI, UTTARANCHAL



Quick Bite

District: Pauri Garhwal, Uttarakhand

How to reach: The nearest airport and railhead is Dehradun at 170 km.

Stay: The Banjara Camp on the banks of the Tons River is the best place to stay.

From the holy waters of the Ganges, my travel takes me to the little town of Mori. Situated along the banks of the Tons River, this is little known part of the picturesque state of Uttaranchal. An ideal getaway to enjoy a laid back holiday or an adrenaline pumping adventure experience, Mori is the place to be.

A visit to the ancient Duryodhana Temple is indeed a treat, this wood-crafted temple is said to have been built by the Pandavas. Closer to nature, a visit to the Lunagad Creek is a half hour walk amidst pine forests and fresh mountain air will bring you to the blue clear plunge pool formed by a small waterfall.

Adventure activities ranges from cycling, rafting and trekking, more laid back options are guided nature walks, bird watching and exploring the diverse flora and fauna.

How to reach: The nearest airport is at Belgaum 65 km away and the nearest railhead is at Londa 35 km.


Stay: The Jungle Lodges Old Magazine house Forest Camp and Jungle Lodges Kali River Lodge are the best options in the region.

From the holy to hills we descend to the picturesque town of Dandeli. Famous for the Kali River with flowing with in all its glory and vigor, the best time to visit is during the monsoons when the whispers turn into roars and the rapids are at its best, promising an adrenaline rush like no other. Rafting along the exciting class 3 rapids amidst the green cover and dense forests home to wide variety of wild animals and flourishing bird life is indeed an exhilarating experience.

Although white water rafting is the most popular activity here, there are plenty of other activities like trekking, bird watching, jungle safari, kayaking, canoeing, river side fishing, overnight camping, croc treks, nature walks and island visits to name a few.

Excursions from here include a visit to the nearby Cavla Caves, Syntheri Rocks and the tribal village.

Stay: There are several hotels and tented accommodation you will find in the region.




