

ECO-FRIENDLY!

Rains receding and the Ganesh Chaturthi fever rising. Most of us can't wait for this festive month to begin, so I just thought I could pen down a few thoughts on how we can make this festival conducive to the environment.

ome September come festivals...Rains receding and the Ganesh Chaturthi fever rising. Most of us cant wait for this festive month to begin, so I just thought I could pen down a few thoughts on how we can make this festival conducive to the environment.

Been there Heard that ... Ganpaties now-a-days are non-bio degradable. Chemical toxic paints are used (lead, chromium, cadmium). Forget pollution, even aquatic life gets affected. Thermocol is used which does not disintegrate for hundreds of years. We all know the problem, so the solution is as follows:-

- 4. Some people use a metal or stone idol. They symbolically immerse this in a bucket of water, or even carry it in procession to the sea, hold it under the water, and then bring it back home.
- Do not use thermocol or plastic as decorations or accessories for your Ganpati idol. Instead, use cloth, wood, paper, and other natural materials that are safer when immersed in water.
- Prasad should be offered in leaves or leaf cups and if these are not available maybe paper plates can be used. Plastic plates or plastic

even the day after the immersion. In fact, most traditionalists consider this to be inauspicious.

In Mumbai, eco-friendly Ganpathis, made out of paper mache and mud are made by IIT Powai and the Sri Aniruddha Upasana Foundation. The latter even takes orders and the idols can be viewed from 7 – 10 pm at the address below. The idols are beautiful, light and biodegradable!

- Avoid the use of idols made from POP. Always go for those made of unbaked natural clay, natural fibre, or even recycled paper. Ensure that the dyes used to colour the idols are organic or vegetable in origin.
- 2. Immerse the idol in a tub or a tank specially made for this purpose. Later, you can discard the water by pouring it into your garden.
- 3. If there is an artificial tank in your area specifically created for immersion purposes, use this instead of a natural source of water such as a lake or the sea.

- packets should be avoided at all costs.
- 7. Collect offerings of flowers and other organic material and put them in a compost pit. These can be used to fertilize your garden. There are big NIRMALAY pots placed by BMC near areas of immersion, they can also be put in there. If you must immerse them, wrap them in newspapers instead of polythene bags



one of its kind initiative is taken with the view to help answer these unending questions, send kids on wondrous adventures and provide them with the resources they need to learn and grow.


WHAT'S NEXT?


One such programme which will be launched very soon to generate active learners, adept at using library resources to further their own development is as follows:-



CHILD DEVELOPMENT: AN EVOLUTION IN PROGRESS

"Growth is not merely a harmonious increase in size, but a transformation."

Development is a process that every child goes through. This process of learning and mastering skills is the work these little geniuses perform in order to be able to grow both in thought and functioning. Apart from the actual growth in size (physical growth), a psycho-social growth of a child (mind growth) occurs parallel to suit the agespecific needs of the child.

What is a developmental milestone?

A developmental milestone is a skill that a child acquires within a specific time frame. For instance, one developmental milestone is learning to walk. Most children learn this skill or developmental milestone between the ages of 9 and 15 months. We now know that our brains are not fully developed at birth.

Children develop skills in four main areas of development:

 Communication (Speech & Understanding spoken language)

- 2. Play and social skills
- 3. Body movements (hands & leg use)
- 4. Self-care skills (child's ability to do things for themselves)

Because children usually acquire developmental milestones or skills during a specific time frame or "window", we can predict when most children will learn different skills.



How can I help my child meet these developmental milestones?

The physical growth of the child is far more easily spotted than the developing mind of the child.







Treasurer, and Shri Shamit Majumdar, Managing Committee member.


The rules were, older the songs greater the points and points were deducted for each wrong song.
